Happy New Year!

WOW!!! We've only just begun 2018 and already there are a lot of things taking place! Here is a quick overview of some of those items, events, and happenings going on or being planned.

First... We have previously written about NEW Training Modules that were going to be introduced. We also stated that as some of the current seminars are being upgraded to the new training format and the old versions were going to be retired. The University Trainers who are not University Instructors will still have access to the Seminar Library in which they were certified. However, over time, some of the old faithful seminars that they have been presenting will be going away.

Seminars within those libraries ARE still available to be presented. When a seminar no longer appears in the library that will be the first clue that it is no longer available to be presented. Some trainers have downloaded old seminars onto a thumb drive and that is permissible. **HOWEVER**, it will be VERY IMPORTANT to ensure that the downloaded seminar is still permitted to be presented AND if it is, that it is current and accurate. We absolutely do not want to be presenting erroneous information to the members!

NEXT.... It has occurred to me that sometimes members and/or Chapter Officers would like to have some form of training offered for their members. In talking with members from throughout the District, I have discovered that one of the most frequent concerns expressed was that the member did not know what is available or how to request training. Most members may be aware that training opportunities cover a wide range of subjects. For instance, there are several classroom training opportunities available; On-Bike Training such as the Advanced Rider Course (ARC), Trike Rider Course (TRC); Life-Saving Courses (CPR/First Aid) are available; and Motorist Awareness training.

To make it easier to request training for Chapters and members, a GWRRA University Training Request Form has been created. The GWRRA University Training Form is located on the District Website. Here is a link that you can use to access the form: <u>https://form.jotform.co/KYTrainer/gwrra-university-training-request-f</u>. You can also go to <u>www.gwrraky.com</u> and access the training form under the University Training tab.

It is easy to fill out. When the request is submitted that request will be forwarded to the District University Coordinator, a list of all the available trainings have been included on the Website. It absolutely makes no difference what kind of training is being requested (Classroom, On-Bike, Life-Saving, or Motorist Awareness) that request **WILL** be acted upon. As information about training opportunities and District events are received, the Events Calendar on the District Website will be updated with the information. It is our hope that having a one-stop shopping experience for training opportunities will benefit our members by presenting them options when they are looking for a specific type of training.

Please feel free to share your ideas with me, Asst. District University Coordinator John Main, District Educator Bill Mucha, or the District Director Rick Broadway. We are here to assist you, the members with whatever you need.
