Kentucky District Directors Spring is just around the corner, and with it comes riding season. We recently held our annual Operations Meeting via Zoom call, and want to thank all those who took the time to attend and provide input.

During the Ops Meeting we discussed the Ride-In, which will be hosted by Chapter G at Big Bone Lick State Park on June 4 and 5. All of the events will be held outside where social distancing can be observed and a good time should be had by all. Check it out and make plans to join us.

We just received confirmation that Wing-Ding is a go and we are looking forward to attending. As stated last month, Kentucky has been tasked with running the GWRRA store on Thursday. We hope you will consider donating some time to help out. It really is a good time.

We also discussed some changes to the visitation and traveling plaque programs during the Ops Meeting. The scoring for the traveling plaque was changed to award 3 points to the chapter winning the plaque instead of 2 points. This was done to give more advantage to winning the plaque and eliminate the disadvantage during the month a chapter has to present the plaque.

The visitation program was given a lot of thought and I appreciate all the input I received prior to making any changes. The main theme I heard from the members is that there should be some emphasis put on riding. The scoring was changed to allow a chapter to participate with only 2 members attending instead of 3, and bonus points will now be awarded for those who ride to visit another chapter. The bonus points will be awarded to each rider or co-rider who arrived on 2 or 3 wheels. During the Zoom call, this was discussed as the BOB (Butts On Bike) bonus, and will reward those riding with extra points. The more members who ride, the more points earned. Please don't be discouraged from attending in a 4 wheeled vehicle, as points are still awarded for the number of chapter members attending, so every member and every point counts.



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District Educator Report

This month I would like to get back to the Levels program. The fourth level is known as **Level IV: Safety By Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness**. Level IV is the most prestigious of the REP levels and is referred to as Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider. It represents the highest commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to safe riding and preparedness. This commitment is shown by a demonstrated history of safe miles and current certification in both First Aid and CPR. These Master Tour Riders and Co-Riders are the finest examples of the highest commitment to safe motorcycle operation and preparedness.

In past articles, I have discussed the meanings of commitment (Level I), and preparedness (Level III). Now let us investigate the meaning of enhanced. In the Meriam-Webster dictionary, we find the definition: to increase or improve in value, quality, desirability, or attractiveness. Enhance was originally formed from adding the prefix *in*- to the Latin word *altus*, meaning "high", and evolved in Middle English to mean "to raise", not so much in a physical sense but more in a figurative sense.

We see examples of enhancement all around us, every day. With our motorcycles, we install safety chrome and lighting accessories to enhance the visibility and style. As individuals, we style our hair, choose our clothing, eat, and exercise, all in ways to make ourselves noticed, to enhance the way we are perceived, to be the best we can be. In our careers and in our hobbies, we constantly look for ways to be more efficient and accurate, to enhance our skills, to become the "master craftsman" of the task at hand.

Those who move on to Level IV are the "master craftsmen" of GWRRA. The Master Tour Riders and Co-Riders are shining examples to the rest of the membership. They are individuals who are caring, trained, and prepared, with the experience to back it up. They become ambassadors for the organization and examples for others to follow. To advance to Level IV, one must be current in Level III for one year and have taken both First Aid and CPR training, have 25,000 Safe Miles and must be committed to riding with "Proper Riding Gear" at all times. GWRRA provides special recognition to celebrate the Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider commitment each year at the District Rally and Wing Ding.

Level IV is the only level in the REP program that requires a one-time financial commitment of \$35.00 for each participant. For this you will receive a "Special Triangular" patch with dark blue border (a Black and Gold patch is available for an additional \$8.00 if you prefer) and your individual Master number embroidered on it, to further enhance your appearance to others.



2021 Kentucky Ride Challenge




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

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Get on the Level

GWRRA Level System

Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Gold Wing Road Riders Association Rider Education Levels Program

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWR-RA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

• The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
 - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) / ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/ shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear. Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
