## **District Educator Report**

Motorcycling is a perishable skill. And while the basic concept of riding changes little over time, our bodies and our environment are constantly changing. Every athlete competing in the Olympics, the MLS, the NFL, and others, goes to a gym, a stadium, or a field to practice daily for hours and hours before the meet, the match, or the game. As motorcyclists, most of us do not have a "practice" location to improve our skillset. Most of what we learn is in the "arena" of the real world, commuting to work, touring on our weekend ride, or riding to find ice cream. Every day is game day. So where can a committed rider and/ or co-rider get their practice?

GWRRA offers many different and interesting courses, both theoretical and practical, for all its members at very reasonable prices. I recently completed the new and improved beta version of the GWRRA Advanced Rider Course. Otherwise known as the ARC, this course offers both theoretical (classroom) and practical (on-bike) instruction to supplement and improve your motorcycle operating knowledge. You may wonder, what is a beta version? A beta version a new program or course of action that is made available for testing, typically by a limited number of users outside the organization that is developing it, before its general release. In other

words, it is a practical application of a theoretical design. Several GWRRA dignitaries were present for the ARC, both as observers and instructors, and I had an opportunity to discuss the course after I completed it and offer my opinion and suggestions. I believe much was learned on both sides and I encourage you to experience the ARC for yourself.

You may also ask; how does this new version differ from the old one? Unfortunately, I cannot answer that question. All my previous formal trainings were under the MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) formats. But I found many similarities in both programs. Both present realistic scenarios which motorcyclists experience every day, and both encourage the importance of forward thinking; planning for what might happen instead of reacting to what is happening.

You may also think, I have taken the course before, and I have not had any incident, why do I need to rehash what I already know? There are many professions that require a refresher course be taken at regular intervals. Repetition is one of the best ways to learn something. The body does what it knows when there is no time to think, only time to act. The ARC and other courses allow you to practice the proper techniques in a controlled and safe environment, so your body learns what to do in an emergency. Each on-bike exercise is performed multiple times, giving each participant a chance to test themselves. And it is my opinion that one never really knows what they have truly learned until they are tested.

I recently checked the Wing Ding website, and there are many, many openings for the ARC and TRC courses. If it has been more than a few years, I highly encourage you to sign up for one. Worst that can happen is you may learn something that may save you from at least an inconvenience, and at most what you learn may save your life and the life of your co-rider. Don't let the only test of your riding skills be when the next traffic incident occurs.


## The Shamrock Ride...Way to Go "A"



Make it an individual or group ride, or even a chapter event, but don't forget your required "thumbs-up" photo. And most of all, HAVE FUN!!!!



## Let's Talk Springfield!

Springfield is the birthplace of the Mother Road, Route 66. Springfield's emergence as the birthplace of Route 66 began back in the 1920's when the federal government first mandated construction of a national highway system. A placard on the east side of Park Central Square commemorates Springfield's 1992 designation as the official birthplace of Route 66.

Missouri is known as The Cave State. About 6,000 caves have been discovered throughout the state The most famous cave is Fantastic Caverns, well known for being one of the largest ride-through caves in North America. Guides stop throughout the cave and explain how the cave and its formations came to be, the group of 12 women who first explored it and how the cave has been used since it was discovered by a farmer's dog in 1862.

A place you can't miss is Lambert's Cafe. Home of the "throwed rolls". Lamberts is located just a few minutes south of Springfield. Lambert's is also known for their popular "pass arounds". Servers bring around macaroni and tomatoes, fried potatoes and onions, black-eyed peas and fried okra. You better be hungry when you go to this place!

#### **GWRRA Level System**

#### Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

**Rider Education Levels Program** 

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWR-RA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

#### **Level 1: Safety By Commitment**

#### Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

#### **Level 2: Safety By Education**

#### Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

#### **Level 3: Safety By Preparedness**

#### Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

#### **Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness**

#### Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
  - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
    ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
    shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
     Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- · Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- · Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
