District Educator Report

On Sunday, March 20, 2022, at 11:33 a.m. EDT for those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, we celebrate the arrival of the Vernal (Spring) Equinox. This means riding season begins! Please be sure to verify your machine is ready, and any maintenance work or other nagging concern has been rectified before you hit the road. Also, be sure to check your riding gear, and plan to make those replacement purchases at the next rally to support the vendors and the organization. But most important of all, be sure to verify your personal condition. Time waits for no one, and Winter has been long and cold. As motorcycling is a physical activity, perhaps now is a suitable time to visit your doctor and get an annual check-up.

Normally, I would also recommend each Member check their Levels status to help them plan to take advantage of Rider Ed courses available at various rallies. Currently the Rider Education Database is still undergoing updates and is inaccessible. As a reminder, Members in the Levels Program participate in an Advanced Rider or Trike Rider Course every three years to advance and maintain levels. The requirement is a full course (classroom and range) alternated with a range-only course every three years.

The alternating requirement had been waived in 2020 and 2021. The waiver (Levels Grace Period) made it possible for more Members to experience time in the saddle to practice and improve their on-bike skills. Since many Members had stopped riding for an extended period due to public health restrictions, it was important to offer this compromise. The grace period was created for GWRRA Members participating in the Levels Program. Due to the restrictions caused by the health crisis, most Members were not able to renew their requirements to earn or maintain their Levels. Members who became non-current in their Levels on or after January 1, 2020, would not have their Levels adversely affected by the months of inactivity from that date forward. There were several extension periods approved when it became evident local restrictions and guidelines across the Association continued to make it difficult to register students and conduct classes. The last and final extension of the grace period for Members who became non-current in the Levels program on or after January 1, 2020, ends June 30th, 2022. If the Member does not complete the required course before June 30th, 2022, the time of inactivity (from the date of expiration until a completed course is realized) will be relevant and will delay advancement in the Levels Program accordingly.

What a great Ops meeting! It was full of information and fun. A big Thank You to the District Directors Rick and Leah for such a wonderful day.

During the Ops meeting, members were informed of all that the GWRRA University has to offer and how they provide so many chances to learn new things, improve skills, and have fun doing it.

KY District will be hosting the GWRRA 101 workshop on March 26, 2022. The workshop will be held at the Boone County Main Library, 1786 Burlington Pike, Burlington KY 41005 from 9:30 am – 4:00 pm.

This is a 1 day workshop that presents the opportunity for discussion of the functions, programs, structure, policies and procedures of GWRRA.

Please register at the link on the KY District website for the class. That way we can get an idea of how many are attending and will have the proper amount of materials available. If you decide at the last minute to join in, that is fine also. We want everyone to have the opportunity to come, learn, and have fun.

Also, we will have an Instructor Training Certification Program on Sunday, March 27, 2022, in Northern KY. Location is to be determined Details will be posted on website as soon as it has been secured. This is a course that gives you the tools to become a University Instructor. Anyone interest in becoming an Instructor must view the videos on the GWRRA University website, complete and submit the Inquiry Form and be scheduled for a debrief Zoom call prior to taking the class. Here is the process:

- Watch the 4 videos that show some segments of an actual class. These can be found on the GWRRA University website. Go to the GWRRA University Website gwrradot.com and select the Menu Choice labeled ITCP Training you will see a drop-down list. From the list, select the item labeled ITCP Videos There are 4 videos on the page. View each video, noting the instructional techniques presented.
- Next, complete the ITCP Inquiry Form found on the ITCP Training menu. When you fill out the form and submit it, you will get placed on a list for a Video debrief.
- 3 After the University receives a number of forms from the candidates, we will schedule the debrief at least 2 weeks prior to the class. It's helpful (but not required) to have multiple candidates on the same video call.
- Once the candidates have successfully completed the debrief, the instructor for their class will send them the code to access the ITCP Prep materials including a "Student Guide" and associated Study Materials approximately 2 weeks prior to the date of their ITCP Class. We give the student 2 weeks of time to become familiar with the Study Guide as well as prepare a 4-minute segment of the "Module" to present to the class.

5. A final debrief will review your performance and understanding of the ITCP format. Instructors then work with the District University Coordinator to schedule and present classes – teaching a minimum of 2 every 24 months. As the KY District University Coordinator, I am looking forward to seeing as many as possible become new University Instructors and willing to help in any way possible to achieve your goals.

At Chapter Gatherings: Training done before or after a Gathering is one of the simplest ways to put together a presentation. Remember, attendance is not limited to your Chapter Members; invite surrounding Chapters. Training is also not limited to Members. Invite those who might be interested in becoming Members. A great way to recruit

GWRRA Level System

Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Rider Education Levels Program

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWR-RA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
 - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
 ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
 shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
 Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- · Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
