Unfortunately, we didn't see Waylon, Willie and the Boys. We spent a day at the Pacific War Museum and the Admiral Chester Nimitz facility, which was well worth the time. We clocked over 1,600 miles on the bikes/trikes and had a great time.

District Educator Report

May is Motorist Awareness Month.

This month I would like to share an article from Bruce Luhrs, the NH-VT District Educator. It is a first-hand account of something we all face every day. It is reproduced in its entirety below with his permission.

"They Looked but Failed to See"

The mission of the GWRRA Motorist Awareness Program is "To Facilitate A Reduction in Motorcycle Accidents through the Education of the Non-Motorcycle Riding Public". For Motorist Awareness Month, I'd like to share information about the most common type of carmotorcycle accident classified as a looked-but-failed-to-see crash.

While on a ride last Fall, I collided with a driver who made a left-hand turn in front-of me into his driveway. He appeared to have stopped to let me pass, but at the last minute turned into me. I was wearing a high-vis jacket, a full-face helmet with high-vis markings and riding my GL1800 Gold Wing with the headlight on. We were the only two vehicles on a long stretch of straight road. The driver said, "he never saw me". Because we believe in the GWRRA's safety mantras - ATGATT and Rider Education, I avoided serious injuries.

My wife, Sue, was baffled by the fact that "he never saw me" and spent some time researching why these types of collisions are so common. There is a very real psychological phenomenon causing this. Inattentional Blindness is defined as "a person is missing critical information even when their eyes are focused on the road ahead". There are two contributing factors:

- It can happen when you are very focused on only one thing while driving. For example, if you become hyper-focused on reaching an exit or turning into a driveway, you can miss other things happening around you on the road.
- Inattentional Blindness is also called Perceptual Blindness. Our brains cannot process every detail of our surroundings all the time, so it concentrates on what is expected to be in our surroundings. In other words, people do not always see new and unexpected things that suddenly appear within their visual field like motorcycles! As many as 92% of households do not own a motorcycle. So, we are a rare group of 8%. Plus, we do not ride all the time, especially here in the Northeast when riding is seasonal. People do not expect to see us! There are a couple ways we can combat this dilemma ride more and promote Motorist Awareness by displaying Check Twice Save a Life ©, Motorcycles are Everywhere bumper stickers.

Sue and I will be in touch with each of the NH-VT District's Chapter Directors to discuss our plans to distribute some bumper stickers. These purchased from Paul Cote at http://www.checktwice-savealife.com/whose mission is to help raise awareness of drivers sharing the road with motorcycles by displaying bumper stickers, signs and other products aimed at reducing motorcycle accidents, injuries, and fatalities. While thanking Sue for our order, Paul also thanked GWRRA members for promoting motorcycle safety awareness aimed at reducing accidents and injuries, and all the positive reflections the owners of Gold Wings generate in the riding community.

Oh, the Places You will Go!"



"Oh, the Places You will Go" a Dr. Seuss quote seems to fit Training in GWRRA. Our own mind takes us to places that we could not go in real time. The University modules take us places we have been and to places that others have been. How you may ask? We use self-discovery, relevance and action-oriented modules, not PowerPoints to take us to places we may never have been.

Self-discovery, relevance and action oriented are the three GWRRA Instructor values taught in the Instructor Training & Certification Program (ITCP).

Self-discovery gives the attendees ownership of the data they receive in the module. The instructor is not teaching, the instructor is facilitating a discussion of the data in the module. Giving you a part of the discussion and therefore, discovering what you knew but didn't know you knew.

The modules are relevant to everyday life, whether it be personal, professional or GWRRA. If the module or seminar you are attending isn't relevant to anything in your daily life you are not apt to attend, unless it is raining or too hot to go for a ride, then you might attend just to escape the elements.

By getting the attendees into action at the beginning and throughout the module, they are more at ease and open to what may lay ahead, which in most cases is something new they have never seen in a seminar or a perhaps a new approach to something old.

"Oh, the Places You will Go" when you attend one of GWRRA University presentations.

Reminder, please go to the website and submit you requests to schedule a training class for your chapter. University presenters are readily available to assist your chapter. Just give us a call.









Hints for using the District Website Events Calendar

In a recent District Team meeting, some question came up about how to use the Events Calendar on our website. The main question was how to find events in the calendar. I hope this article will help with that question.

The Events Calendar can be found at: https://www.gwrraky.com/events-calendar/. The page has some text at the for the Ride-In and the Blast and then it has a Google Calendar that shows the various events. The calendar includes all of the chapter gatherings as well as District events such as the Ride-In and the Blast. If chapters want to include some of their rides on the calendar, our District Ride Coordinator, Don Price, has sent instructions to the Chapter Directors and Ride Coordinators on how to get a ride included on the calendar. As shown below, the calendar has three tabs in the upper right corner that can be used to show the data by the Week or Month and also includes an Agenda tab that shows a list of the events.

If you chose the Agenda tab, you will see the following:



If you click on one of the events, you will see more details about that event.

In the Agenda view, you can scroll up to see previous events and you can scroll down to see future events. As you scroll, the browser may need to load more data in the view. Once the data is loaded, you can use the "Find" feature of the browser to search for events. As the browser loads more data as you scroll, you may need to start your search again so the browser will search all the data that has been loaded. I would suggest you scroll up or down until the browser has data for the time frame you want to search and then start your search.


As an example, if you want to see all of the Chapter A events for 2022, scroll up until you see January 2022 is included and then scroll down until you see all of December is included in the view. One you have the data loaded, start your search and you should be able to find all of the chapter A events for the time frame you need. Once the search is completed, you should be able to scroll through the calendar and each time the search string was found, the string will be highlighted.

I have tried the Chrome and Edge browsers on Windows as well as the Chrome browser on my iPhone and iPad and have been able to find the data I am looking for. Your results may be different on other browsers. It is also possible that the browsers or Google calendar may change but hopefully the search feature in the Agenda View will not be removed.

Please let me know if you have any suggestions or questions about the calendar.


Greetings to all!





Get on the Level

GWRRA Level System

Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Rider Education Levels Program

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWR-RA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
 - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
 ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
 shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
 Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- · Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
